## Live Virtual Online Meeting using ZOOM Audio/Video Conference Software

#### 3. Field Trips

- Nature's Classroom, Freedom, NH- May 18-20, 2022
- 8<sup>th</sup> Grade DC Trip, Washington, C- May 2022

Mr. Hartunian and Ms. Coletta went over the updated protocols for both the Nature's Classroom and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Washington, DC field trips, as both trips were previously presented and voted on for approval by the School Committee at a previous meeting. The new protocols are as follows for each trip:

#### Nature's Classroom

- Anyone testing positive will not be allowed to travel
  - o If anyone whom is feeling ill will not be allowed to travel
- PCR test must be done on the Monday before the trip
  - Pool testing results can be used for this
  - Families are encouraged to sign up for pool testing at school/ Otherwise they
     will need to find their own testing site and turn in results prior to departure
- Rapid test must be done prior to departure
- Testing will be done prior to return to Bedford
- Hoping to get trip back on track for October dates as before
- Students not participating will do other activities with teachers that didn't go on the trip

# Washington, DC

- PCR Test will be required 3 days prior to departure
  - o Anyone with a positive test will not be allowed to travel
  - If student tests positive for COVID while on the trip World Stride has options available to families to get to DC to pick-up their child
  - Nurse will be on site and a doctor will be on call
- Students will be in rooms of 4 at hotel
- Masks will be worn where required
- As many outdoor activities as possible will be planned
- World Stride has Scholarships available to assist those that may need it
- Students not participating will do other activities with teachers that didn't go on the trip

Mr. Conrad sent condolences out to Bedford Charter on the recent passing of one of their drivers Joe Criminson. Our cooperative Gymnastics Team came in 3<sup>rd</sup> place this season. Sarah McGinley reported on the Hanscom meeting that took place recently. Ms. McGinley gave a few examples of the take-aways from the meeting; consistency

of having policies for transferring of credits- as many families transferring from other parts of the country the credits don't always match up, social emotional and mental health of students transferring from military bases.
